CREATE YOUR FUTURE SCHOLARSHIP

Terms and Conditions

1. This scholarship application is open to any high school students currently in grade 12, enrolled at any secondary school in Canada. Quebec residents are excluded from participation in this scholarship offer.
2. Applicant must be in good standing with their secondary school. Applications from students who are on academic probation, suspended, or expelled from their secondary school will not be considered.
3. In order to receive this scholarship, winners will be asked to sign a scholarship agreement letter covering policies of the college, terms and conditions of this award etc.
4. By applying for this scholarship, all applicants consent to the collection of their personal information to be used as it pertains to this scholarship, our full-time programs and other CAT-related content.
5. Family members of existing staff, faculty and judging panel members are not eligible to participate in this scholarship offer.
6. One full scholarship will be awarded to the winner, and three \$5000 scholarships will be awarded to the runners up. Value of the full scholarship will depend on the program of selection for the winner. Range of value for full scholarship is \$21,710 to \$41,140.
7. Submissions must be full and complete; no partial applications will be considered.
8. Scholarship applications open on Monday February 27th, 2023, and complete submissions for scholarship consideration must be received on or before Wednesday, June 28th, 2023.
9. The Adjudication & Interview Phase will commence on Thursday June 29th, 2023, and finish on Thursday July 13th, 2023. The Adjudication panel will consist of a Program Department Head, an Industry Member or Program Alumni, CAT's Director of Education, CAT's Marketing Director and could also include additional members of CAT's Senior Leadership Team.
10. Shortlisted applicants will be contacted for an interview with the adjudication committee.
11. Scholarship winners will be informed privately the week of July 24th -28th , and public announcement of winners will take place shortly afterward. Date to be announced.
12. Scholarship tiers include Tier One – Full Scholarship, and Tier Two – \$5,000 Scholarship.
13. Scholarships must be used within 2 calendar years from the date of winner announcement and are only applicable to full-time CAT programs.
14. Scholarships must be redeemed by the winner and are non-transferrable and have no cash value.
15. Centre for Arts and Technology reserves the right to evaluate all submissions privately.
16. Winner(s) will be chosen through a combination of review and critique of submitted materials, suitability of applicant for full-time program enrollment, and overall quality of submission.
17. Winners will have their scholarship held in trust by CAT until first day of Quarter start.
18. In the event the winner cancels their CAT full-time program application prior to the start of their program, they forfeit the ability to use the scholarship funds at a future date. A withdrawal from the program will be considered a withdrawal of the award. The student would then owe the school the full program tuition (with no award discount).

19. Winners agree to participate in ongoing promotion of CAT for 2 years from the date of scholarship award, as directed by CAT Marketing. Promotions may include but are not limited to guest blogging, social media posts and videos, and appearances at events. All promotions as a result of this scholarship will be completed as a joint effort between the winners and CAT Marketing.
20. The award is dependent upon the student completing the program and remaining in good academic standing throughout the duration of the program. Based on instructor evaluations the student must maintain an 80% grade average per quarter. If a student falls below the 80% grade average, a review must be completed by the Director of Education and a course of action determined, which may include but is not limited to: loss of award, suspension of award, or course retakes.
21. If, for any reason, the student is suspended, put on probation, or in any other way prevented from progressing in the program towards graduation, the student will automatically become ineligible for the award. If, for any reason, the student is required to repeat a course, the student will be responsible for covering the associated expenses. The award cannot be applied to course retakes.
22. Works created as a full-time student may be used for marketing and education purposes.
23. All winners will participate as positive advocates and contributors to the school and acknowledge that all materials and information submitted as part of this contest are factual and original. For further clarification, it is expected that the winners always represent the school in a positive professional manner and may also be called upon to participate in school events.
24. In the case of forces outside of our control, CAT reserves the right to cancel, amend, rescind or suspend this offer at any time.
